
- Federal environment and cultural requirements apply to all sites, including contractor-selected sites
 - Government-provided optional sites
 - Cleared environmentally and culturally
 - Little to no cost or schedule impacts, and impacts are known
 - Contractor-selected sources
 - Contractor responsible for Federal cultural and environmental clearances
 - State and/or local permits or clearances are not sufficient
 - Potential cost and schedule impacts to project



- **Commercial sources – low potential project impacts**

- **Considered cleared to Federal standards**
- **Meet the following criteria:**

- **Established**
- **Have provided material to public and private entities on a regular basis over the last two years**
- **Have appropriate State and local permits**
- **Do not require expansion outside the currently established and permitted area**





- **Noncommercial sites – higher potential project impacts**
 - **Contractor is responsible for clearing to Federal standards**
 - **Cultural resources**
 - **Threatened, endangered, and candidate species**
 - **Wetlands and waters of the US**
 - **Above requirements apply to private and public, developed and undeveloped, sites**



- Obtain required assessments by qualified professionals
 - Cultural resources specialist/Archaeologist
 - Wildlife/Fisheries Biologist
 - Wetland Ecologist
- Professional assessments must yield “No Effect” call
- Submit required documentation to WFLHD for approval and submission for concurrence
 - Process requires minimum of 30 days
- Consulting fees



- Hazardous materials/wastes
- Forest Service and National Park Service requirements
 - Weed-free
 - Material compatibility
- Water sources
 - Water rights
 - Aquatic organism
 - Aquatic habitat
