



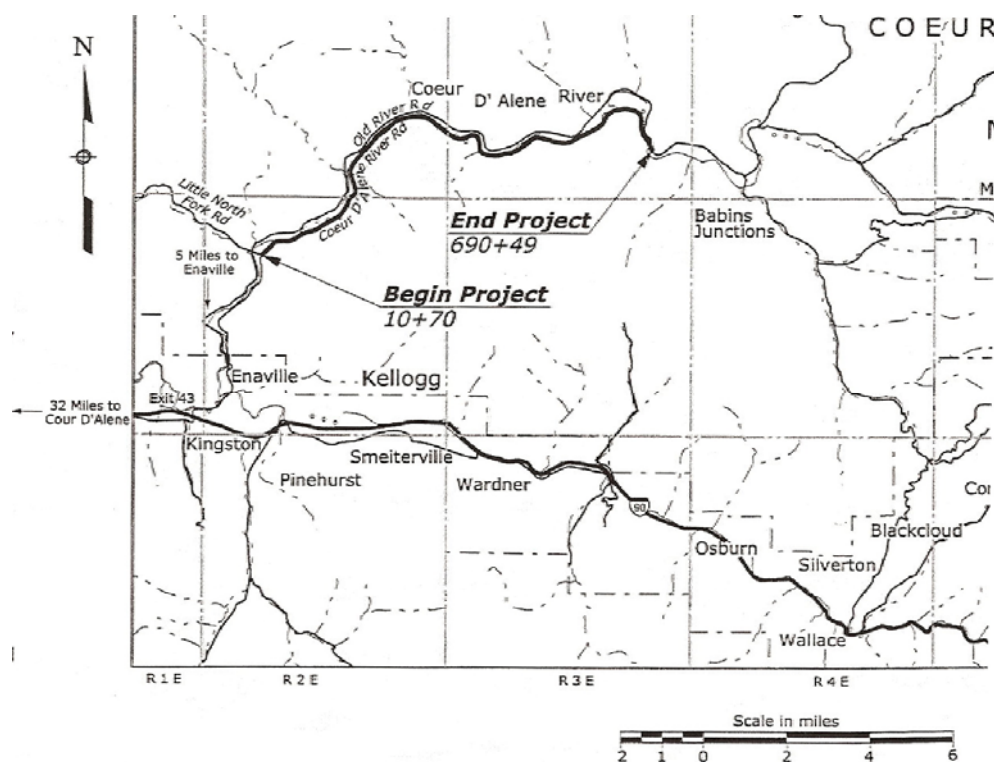
Enaville-Thompson Pass Road



Weekly Newsletter

SYNOPSIS: The Enaville-Thompson Pass Road project began on May 1 and involves re-surfacing 12.9 miles of Forest Highway 9 from the junction with Forest Development Road 209 (Bumble Bee Road) to the bridge crossing the Coeur d'Alene River. Project specifics include cold in-place recycling for existing asphalt, overlay of hot asphalt concrete pavement, and subexcavation in areas of poor or frost susceptible subgrade soils.

ACTIVITIES FOR WEEK OF MAY 25-29: Multiple work zones are present within the project boundaries. Clearing and ditch work is progressing and now being carried out along the southbound lane. We anticipate that clearing work will be completed by the first week of June. Some subexcavation and backfilling segments have been completed and work continues in the northbound lane.
