



Enaville-Thompson Pass Road

SYNOPSIS: The Enaville-Thompson Pass Road project began on May 1 and involves re-surfacing 12.9 miles of Forest Highway 9 from the junction with Forest Development Road 209 (Bumble Bee Road) to the bridge crossing the Coeur d'Alene River. Project specifics include cold in-place recycling for existing asphalt, overlay of hot asphalt concrete pavement, and sub-excavation in areas of poor or frost susceptible subgrade soils.

ACTIVITIES FOR WEEK OF August 3-7: The cold recycling train will complete milling in the southbound lane and conduct touch-up efforts in the northbound lane. Culvert cleaning in tandem with ditch reconditioning continues throughout the project corridor. Guardrail removal and installation will begin. The first lift of paving will be applied; a control strip will be applied during the first day of production.
