Travel and Construction Update



WINTER-SPRING

The alpine portion of the road remains closed to vehicular traffic while park road crews begin their annual snow plowing operations. The west-side vehicular closure point is currently at Lake McDonald Lodge yet will move to the Avalanche Developed Area soon, where it will remain until June 19. The east-side closure is currently at Rising Sun. Hikers and bicyclist are allowed beyond the vehicular closure point but should be alert for construction traffic at all times as construction is currently ongoing in the Avalanche Picnic and Campground area. Prior to the completion of plowing and the annual road opening, work will resume above Siyeh Bend on the east side and below Haystack Creek on the west. SUMMER-FALL

Construction will be on-going on the west-side throughout the summer in the 2 mile section below Haystack Creek and later in the season shift to a 2.9 mile segment west of Logan Pass. Visitors can expect delays of 30 minutes (or less) for their trip across the 50 mile long road. Midnight Sunday, September 20, 2009, a portion of the road will be closed to travel for accelerated construction. Logan Pass will be accessible from St. Mary until weather, once again, forces retreat from the alpine sections of the Going-to-the-Sun Road.
